### As a clinician, how confident do you feel in recognising and responding to Domestic Abuse during consultations?

IRISi has recently launched its "Introduction to the IRIS programme for GPs and Primary Care Networks" guide, where we explain how and why IRIS can help clinicians to identify possible signs of Domestic Abuse (DA) among their female patients.


According to the Department of Health, 80% of women in a violent relationship seek help from health services and these are often a woman's first, or only, point of contact. It means that, if you are a clinician, it's possible that you will be the first or only professional who may have the chance to identify these patients.

THE IRIS PROGRAMME WAS DEVELOPED TO PROVIDE TRAINING, SUPPORT AND REFERRAL PATHWAYS FOR GENERAL PRACTICE TEAMS AND THEIR PATIENTS ACROSS THE UK.

"It is very important that healthcare professionals are fully prepared to recognise and respond to the symptoms of DA, especially because this social disease can produce signs that are hard to see at a first sight", explains Medina Johnson, CEO at IRISi.

#### Landmark Domestic Abuse Bill receives Royal Assent

The Domestic Abuse Bill passed both Houses of Parliament and was signed into law on 29 April 2021. The Domestic Abuse Act will provide further protections to the millions of people who experience domestic abuse and strengthen measures to tackle perpetrators.

For the first time in history there will be a wide-ranging legal definition of domestic abuse which incorporates a range of abuses beyond physical violence, including emotional, coercive or controlling behaviour, and economic abuse. The measures include important new protections and support for victims.

While IRISi welcomes the new Act, it doesn't go far enough and we will continue to work with our partners in the violence against women and girls sector to lobby for strengthening for support for migrant women and the response to perpetrators. We are pleased to see the Act prohibits GPs and other health professionals from charging a victim of domestic abuse for a letter to support an application for legal aid. READ MORE>>




## TRAINING ROLLOUT
