Assessing for Domestic Violence and Abuse in Sexual Health Environments

The ADViSE programme will soon be implemented in the UK!

Developed and promoted by IRISi, the ADVISE (Assessing for Domestic Violence and Abuse in Sexual Health Environments) Programme will be officially implemented in its first area within the next quarter.

The initiative supports sexual health staff to identify and respond to patients affected by domestic violence and abuse (DVA), helping to refer them on to specialist services, and has originated from IRIS (Identification and Referral to Improve Safety) — a successful, evidence-based programme in general practice which responded to patients affected by domestic abuse.

Whilst the positive impact of IRIS was rapidly expanding, it was recognised that there were some diverse and harder to reach patient populations who may not come into contact with general practice or other primary care services.

Sexual health clinicians are already trusted by their patients with highly confidential, potentially stigmatising information and are particularly adept at working in diverse populations and with vulnerable groups. Sexual health services are therefore in a strong position to support early recognition of undisclosed or unidentified DVA and offer an appropriate response. This can improve and save lives.
